



Selia Qynn's home is a Backyard Habitat certified by the National Wildlife Federation. Located on three quarter acre in Spring Branch, her garden comprises three adjoining properties and features a 12,000 gallon pond with bog, lily, and koi areas divided by stepping stones and a cobblestone island. The pond has both large and small waterfalls, and a statuary fountain. Additionally there are numerous water features including disappearing fountains, ponds, waterfalls, and streams as well as little nooks for sitting and enjoying her menagerie of animals which include ducks, geese, a rabbit, chickens, and 2 aviaries.

Selia is a nature steward committed to attracting wildlife and helping restore and create habitats by providing food in the form of foliage, nectar, pollen, berries, seeds, and nuts that many species of wildlife require to survive and thrive. There are clean water sources of ponds, bird baths, and butterfly puddles. She practices sustainable gardening practices including chemical free, composting, vegetable gardening, mulching, and turf reduction. Visitors will also enjoy her beehive, artistic installations, and variety of plants.
